This year, the corn maze design features a magical journey to Neverland with its Peter Pan 'Never Grow Up' theme. The MAIZE pathways, forming images of an enchanting fairytale, are carved into more than one million corn stalks.

Outside of the cornfield, visitors young and old can embrace the ultimate FARMSTEAD experience with their family and friends, including hayrides, pumpkin picking, pig races, The Creature, great food, and much more. The Field of Screams haunted experience is available Friday and Saturday nights during October. Throughout the season, The FARMSTEAD will host a variety of special events including a Scarecrow Jamboree with local Scout troops, a celebration of our Hometown Heroes, Grandparents Day, Dog Day, Touch-A-Tractor event, Patch's Pumpkin Party to celebrate all things pumpkin, and the annual Candy in the Corn Trick-or-Treating.

In addition to providing wholesome entertainment opportunities for families and young adults, The FARMSTEAD mission includes educating children about the relevance of agriculture through on-farm field trips and the Food Plate rewards program.

The FARMSTEAD will be open to the public September 25 - October 31, Monday-Thursday from 4-9 pm; Fridays from 4-11 pm; and Saturdays from 10 am 11 pm. It is closed Sundays.
